CHARLES EDWARD HAVILAND, OF LIMOGES, FRANCE.

DESIGN FOR THE ORNAMENTATION OF DISHES.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 17,061, dated January 11, 1887.

Application filed November 20, 1886. Serial No. 219,527. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES EDWARD HAVILAND, a citizen of the United States, residing at the city of Limoges, in the Republic of France, have invented and produced a new and original Design for the Ornamentation of Dishes, which is described and fully represented in the following specification and accompanying fac-similes, forming a part of the same.

The accompanying fac-simile illustrates, as one of the many dishes to which this design is applicable, a perspective view of a plate embodying said design.

The characteristic feature of this design is the ornamental pattern consisting of a comparatively straight stem having upon each side groups of leaves arranged in nearly opposite positions, substantially as shown in the accompanying fac-simile.

The groups A on the one side of the stem B

are represented as approximately opposite the groups C on the other side of the stem B, and said groups are shown for the most part as composed of four leaves. These details may, however, be slightly varied without departing from the essential characteristic feature.

What is claimed is—

The design for the ornamentation of dishes, the same consisting of the pattern formed by a comparatively straight stem, having on each side groups of leaves arranged at nearly opposite points, substantially as shown and described.
