STATEMENT.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that HEMP & Co. (CORP.), a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Missouri, and located and doing business on Vandeventer avenue, near Shaw avenue, in the city of St. Louis, State of Missouri, has adopted the trade-mark shown in the accompanying drawing, for stovepipes and stovepipe-elbows, Class 34, Heating, lighting, and ventilating apparatus, not including electrical apparatus.

The trade-mark has been continuously used in the business of said corporation since about the 1st day of December, 1899.

The trade-mark is applied to the cartons containing the goods by means of a rubber stamp or stencil, or is stamped in the material of which the pipe is formed.
